Community Policing News – Kelso & District

We are continuing or efforts to obtain information regarding drug dealing and antisocial behaviour. We urge members of the community to continue to make police aware of these incidents by contacting 101, providing names and descriptions if possible. PC Kirsty Chisholm has been working in partnership with SBHA to tackle issues in Orchard Park and calls to the area have decreased in recent months. She is also working with the dog warden as there has been more reports of dog fouling in the area, particularly in the area of Woodside Park. Incidents of antisocial behaviour have also increased at the Shedden Playpark and patrols have increased in this area.

Protecting most vulnerable

In October 2022 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 72 mental health related calls, around 25 missing person enquiries and approximately 40 domestic related incidents.

Kelso and District had 13 mental health related calls and 3 missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



Reducing violence and ASB

Assault

On 02/10/2022 report of assault and vandalism at Horsemarket. Male traced and charged with assault and vandalism.

On 02/10/2022 report of an assault within the Black Swan Hotel, Horsemarket, Kelso. Enquiries ongoing.

Anti-Social Behaviour

On 01/10/2022 report of a disturbance in The Square, Kelso involving a large group of youths fighting. Officers attended, no disturbance ongoing, and no complaints made.

On 08/10/2022 report of disturbance in Jamiesons Court, Kelso. No crimes established and no further police action.

On 21/10/2022 report of a disturbance in Maxmill Park, Kelso. No complaints made, male was taken back to his home address.

On 22/10/2022 report of a disturbance outside the Border Inn, Kirk Yetholm, Kelso. Enquiries ongoing.

On 23/10/2022 report of a disturbance at Grovehill, Kelso. Male was taken home, as no complaints were made.

Vandalism

On 04/10/2022 report of vandalism to play equipment at Shedden Park Road, Kelso. Enquiries ongoing.

On 22/10/2022 report of vandalism at Kelso Racecourse, Male was traced and charged with two vandalisms to motor vehicles.

On 23/10/2022 report of a window pane being smashed to a property in Maxmill Park, Kelso. Enquiries ongoing.

Reducing acquisitive crime

Campaigns

Scams

Victims of Phone / Internet / Doorstep Scams continue to be provided with an incident follow-up information pack containing advice intended to prevent repeat victimisation. High Value Bike Thefts from Vehicles

Following a spate of bike thefts from visitors vehicles in the Peebles area, work is ongoing to place warning signage at hotspot areas in Peebles, Innerleithen and Glentress. Prevention advice leaflets are also to be distributed to local businesses such as cafes, hotels etc.

Keep Safe Initiative

Primarily aimed at disabled members of the community helping to tackle disability hate crime, Keep Safe is a national network of over 800 safe places (including shops, libraries, pubs etc.) for anyone who may feel lost, scared or vulnerable when out in the community. All Scottish Borders Co-ops have signed up to the scheme with staff training, business packs and store signage being provided.

No Cold Calling Zones

- A new Zone has been set up in Eddleston covering 120 Houses Road signs and house-packs have been provided.
- Implementation work is ongoing with Bowden and Newtown St Boswells community councils for zones in these areas.

Rural Crime

 Scottish Borders Partnership against Rural Crime (SBPARC) exhibited at the Border Union Show highlighting the latest rural crime prevention advice. The partnership continues to meet regularly to address local priority rural crime throughout the year.

We continued to distribute free wireless perimeter security alarms and crime prevention advice to farmers and rural business. These can be requested by Farmers / Rural businesses using the Contact Us Form on the Police Scotland Website.

CAT Update:

ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

After a period with few calls relating to youth disorder, the Galashiels Interchange has experienced a rise in reported incidents. SBCAT and local officers have now increased passing attention, with a number of warning letters being sent to parents of children being identified. We will continue to address any reported issues and support the work being carried out by local CPT and TD7. Bonfire night is approaching and there is likely to be an increase in calls relating to fireworks. Please can I encourage members of the public to report any incidents of youths being supplied fireworks to police or anonymously via Crimestoppers. So far SBCAT have obtained 35 fireworks through information provided by members of the public.

PARKING

We have carried out parking initiatives in Selkirk and Peebles this month with 12 parking tickets issued. Can I take this opportunity to remind people that a single yellow line has the same restrictions as double yellow lines between certain hours.

DRUG ENFORCEMENT

During October SBCAT carried out four search warrants in Hawick, Eyemouth and Kelso. At one address a cannabis cultivation was recovered, and at another a supply amount of herbal cannabis was also found.

ROAD SAFETY

SBCAT have issued the following road traffic tickets this month; 1 x Careless Driving, 2 x No Insurance (with both vehicles being seized), 1 x Antisocial Driving Warning, and 6 other various traffic tickets (e.g. no MOT). We are also continuing to carry out static road checks in rural areas to deter and detect acquisitive crime.
