Kelso and District Community Councils Multi Member Ward Report for November 2022

Community Update - Kelso & District

Community Officers have been busy throughout November with both local Bonfire events and the Remembrance Day services and parades.

In addition they have continued their partnership working with local schools where they give prevention inputs and engage with the children at schools across the ward areas. The work of the school link community officers is more important now than ever before. Early engagement doesn't just reduce the likelihood of offending - educational inputs by our officers also reduce the likelihood our young people will become victims of crime.

Officers are aware of complaints regarding speeding and parking and numerous locations throughout the Borders. We are consistent in our approach to enforcement – where there is a history of collisions or a school then we can ask for the assistance of Roads Policing or the CAT officers. Community Officers are being trained up in the use of the speed guns, but again these officers must be deployed in the areas where the risk of accidents is at its greatest, so that we are using our resources efficiently and effectively.

Parking is similar – where there is dangerous or obstructive parking we must prioritise our resources to tackle these issues first and foremost.

Protecting most vulnerable

In November 2022 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 158 mental health related calls, around 39 missing person enquiries and approximately 67 domestic related incidents.

Kelso and District had 21 mental health related calls and 5 missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



Reducing violence and ASB

Campaigns

Scams

Victims of Phone / Internet / Doorstep Scams continue to be provided with an incident follow-up information pack containing advice intended to prevent repeat victimisation. High Value Bike Thefts from Vehicles

Following a spate of bike thefts from visitors vehicles in the Peebles area, work is ongoing to place warning signage at hotspot areas in Peebles, Innerleithen and Glentress. Prevention advice leaflets are also to be distributed to local businesses such as cafes, hotels etc.

Keep Safe Initiative

Primarily aimed at disabled members of the community helping to tackle disability hate crime, Keep Safe is a national network of over 800 safe places (including shops, libraries, pubs etc.) for anyone who may feel lost, scared or vulnerable when out in the community. <u>About Keep Safe</u> (iammescotland.co.uk)

All Scottish Borders Co-ops have signed up to the scheme with staff training, business packs and store signage being provided.

No Cold Calling Zones

- A new Zone has been set up in Eddleston covering 120 Houses Road signs and house-packs have been provided.

Rural Crime

 Scottish Borders Partnership against Rural Crime (SBPARC) exhibited at the Border Union Show highlighting the latest rural crime prevention advice. The partnership continues to meet regularly to address local priority rural crime throughout the year.

We continued to distribute free wireless perimeter security alarms and crime prevention advice to farmers and rural business. These can be requested by Farmers / Rural businesses using the <u>Contact Us Form</u> on the Police Scotland Website.

CAT Update:

ROAD SAFETY, RURAL ACQUISITIVE CRIME

Officers from SBCAT again joined with officers from Northumbria police, Dumfries & Galloway and Roads Policing officers in November to carry out a second Op Checkpoint, the overnight initiative to tackle rural crime by conducting a series of checkpoints along the English / Scottish border. Officer from SBCAT will continue to support such initiatives in the future, and endeavour to tackle rural crime wherever possible.

DRUG ENFORCEMENT

SBCAT have assisted with the execution of six drugs warrants in Galashiels and Hawick during November. During these over £5000 cash has been recovered, along with cannabis, heroin and diazepam.

IMPROVING ROAD SAFETY

Throughout November SBCAT have been out conducting static road checks for the Winter Safety Campaign, checking vehicles and in particular tyre tread depth. Advice was given to a number of drivers. We were also involved in a vehicle pursuit after which the driver was charged with a number of offences including drink driving. Parking issues in Berwickshire have also been addressed.

ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

SBCAT have carried out high visibility patrols in identified youth hotspots in Peebles, Galashiels and Hawick. We are working with our counterparts in Community Policing to address any identified antisocial behaviour issues. We were also deployed over the bonfire night weekend to address any reports of ASB.

REMEMBERANCE SUNDAY

SBCAT assisted colleagues in ensuring that Remembrance Sunday passed safely and without incident, with SBCAT Sgt PS Harrison laying the wreath on behalf of Police Scotland at the Galashiels service.
