# **Community Update - Kelso & District**

February was an extremely busy month for officers in the Scottish Borders with several serious incidents resulting in increased demand for officers from across the sub division.

Due to this, local officers PC's Paul Owenson and Kirsty Chisholm were abstracted to other areas, as well as response policing in their own area for a large proportion of the month. CAT officers have been covering community issues and their update is below.

# **Protecting most vulnerable**

In February 2023 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 139 mental health related calls, around 26 missing person enquiries and approximately 78 domestic related incidents.

Kelso & District had 18 mental health related calls and 4 missing person enquiry. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



# **Reducing violence and ASB**

#### **Assault**

On 06/02/2023 report of assault from a male outside Sainsbury's, Pinnaclehill Industrial Estate, Kelso. Enquiries ongoing.

On 11/02/2023 report of an assault occurring in Farriers Court, Kelso. Officers attended and arrested a male for assault and threatening and abusive behaviour. Male was held in custody for court the following day.

On 28/02/2023 report of a male being assaulted in Crawford Street, Kelso. Enquiries ongoing.

#### **Anti-Social Behaviour**

On 11/02/2022 report of a disturbance at a property in Maxmill Park, Kelso. Officers attended and no disturbance evident, no evidence of a crime.

On 21/02/2023 report of a male causing a disturbance in Horesemarket, Kelso. Enquiries ongoing.

On 22/02/2023 report of a disturbance within a property in Roxburgh Street, Kelso. Officers attended and no disturbance, males within were intoxicated and speaking loudly.

On 22/02/2023 report of a disturbance within Grove House, Edenside Road, Kelso. Officers attended and no crimes identified, all parties given appropriate advice.

On 24/02/2023 report of a disturbance within a property in Inchmyre, Kelso. Officers attended and no crimes detected.

#### Vandalism

On 14/02/2023 report of vandalism to a shop window in Bridge Street, Kelso, whereby a window was smashed by a stone by unknown person. Enquiries ongoing.

# **Campaigns**

## Scams

Victims of Phone / Internet / Doorstep Scams continue to be provided with an incident follow-up information pack containing advice intended to prevent repeat victimisation. This pack now includes a copy of the latest "Little Book of Big Scams" which covers a huge variety of common scams. <u>Little Book of Big Scams – Cyber Scotland</u>

## **High Value Bike Thefts from Vehicles**

Following a spate of bike thefts from visitors vehicles in the Peebles area, work is ongoing to place warning signage at hotspot areas in Peebles, Innerleithen and Glentress. Prevention advice leaflets are also to be distributed to local businesses such as cafes, hotels etc.

#### **Keep Safe Initiative**

Primarily aimed at disabled members of the community helping to tackle disability hate crime, Keep Safe is a national network of over 800 safe places (including shops, libraries, pubs etc.) for anyone who may feel lost, scared or vulnerable when out in the community. All Scottish Borders Co-ops have signed up to the scheme with staff training, business packs and store signage being provided.

## **No Cold Calling Zones**

- A new Zone has been set up in Eddleston covering 120 Houses Road signs and house-packs have been provided.
- Implementation work is ongoing with Bowden and Newtown St Boswells community councils for zones in these areas.

#### **Rural Crime**

 Scottish Borders Partnership against Rural Crime (SBPARC) exhibited at the Border Union Show highlighting the latest rural crime prevention advice. The partnership continues to meet regularly to address local priority rural crime throughout the year.

We continued to distribute free wireless perimeter security alarms and crime prevention advice to farmers and rural business. These can be requested by Farmers / Rural businesses using the Contact Us Form on the Police Scotland Website.

## **CAT Update:**

ROAD SAFETY –SBCAT have issued 9 traffic tickets throughout the month, with two people being reported to the Procurator Fiscal for a number of offences including no MOT & insurance. We continue to carry out static checks to prevent and detect traffic offences. Speed Gun checks are being carried out outside schools and where there is a recognised casualty profile, and we are liaising with partners with a view to implementing a community speedwatch scheme in the future.

PARKING TICKETS – SBCAT issued 22 parking tickets in February.

RURAL ACQUISITIVE CRIME – Static road checks also help deter and detect rural acquisitive crime. 78 static checks were carried out throughout the Scottish Borders in February. We are also continuing to develop our relationship with neighbouring forces to address cross border crime and travelling criminals.

DRUG ENFORCEMENT – 4 drug search warrants were carried out in January in Hawick and Kelso, with 3 of them providing positive results. Personal amounts of drugs were seized.

PROTECTING VULNERABLE PEOPLE – Part of the SBCAT role is to trace persons wanted on warrant. In February SBCAT traced and arrested five persons who were wanted on warrant. We were also involved in the recent child abduction in Galashiels, initially assisting with the search and thereafter with the enquiry and public reassurance.

ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR – High visibility patrols and engagement with youths continue in Burnfoot Industrial Estate. We have also been liaising with partners to address ongoing youth issues reported at the Galashiels Interchange.
