Community Update - Kelso & District

Events season is in full swing with the final week of Hawick Common riding currently taking place. Local officers look forward to Kelso Civic Week next month

Last month's report mentioned changes to the structure of community policing in the Scottish Borders, and I also spoke about this at the Cheviot Area Partnership meeting. I have attached a letter from the Deputy Local Area Commander, Inspector Robbie Noble alongside this report to provide some clarification.

Community Officers are not funded by Scottish Borders Council and are the first point of contact for communities regarding any issues or problems. There is one community officer per ward area – Kelso and District have PC Paul Owenson.

Community Action Team officers are funded by Scottish Borders Council, and there are two officers per Area Locality – Cheviot has PC Kirsty Chisholm and PC Bruce Anderson. They work closely with the Community Officers providing action in areas of concern.

Protecting most vulnerable

In May 2023 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 207 mental health related calls, around 31 missing person enquiries and approximately 85 domestic related incidents.

Kelso & District had 27 mental health related calls and 3 missing person enquiry. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



Reducing violence and ASB

Assault

On 07/05/2023 report of assault in Shedden Park, Kelso. A youth has been charged with assault. Partner agencies have also been notified and relevant paperwork submitted.

Anti-Social Behaviour

Improving road safety

On 22/05/2023 Speed check carried out by Roads Policing at Eccles where 5 drivers were warned

On 23/05/2023 Speed check carried out by Roads Policing at Kelso where two drivers warned and two conditional offers were issued (see below).

Campaigns

Scams

Victims of Phone / Internet / Doorstep Scams continue to be provided with an incident follow-up information pack containing advice intended to prevent repeat victimisation. This pack now includes a copy of the latest "Little Book of Big Scams" which covers a huge variety of common scams. Little Book of Big Scams – Cyber Scotland

High Value Bike Thefts from Vehicles

Following a spate of bike thefts from visitors vehicles in the Peebles area, work is ongoing to place warning signage at hotspot areas in Peebles, Innerleithen and Glentress. Prevention advice leaflets are also to be distributed to local businesses such as cafes, hotels etc.

Keep Safe Initiative

Primarily aimed at disabled members of the community helping to tackle disability hate crime, Keep Safe is a national network of over 800 safe places (including shops, libraries, pubs etc.) for anyone who may feel lost, scared or vulnerable when out in the community. <u>About Keep Safe</u> (iammescotland.co.uk)

All Scottish Borders Co-ops have signed up to the scheme with staff training, business packs and store signage being provided.

No Cold Calling Zones

- A new Zone has been set up in Eddleston covering 120 Houses Road signs and house-packs have been provided.
- Implementation work is ongoing with Bowden and Newtown St Boswells community councils for zones in these areas.

Rural Crime

• Scottish Borders Partnership against Rural Crime (SBPARC) exhibited at the Border Union Show highlighting the latest rural crime prevention advice. The partnership continues to meet regularly to address local priority rural crime throughout the year.

We continued to distribute free wireless perimeter security alarms and crime prevention advice to farmers and rural business. These can be requested by Farmers / Rural businesses using the <u>Contact</u> <u>Us Form</u> on the Police Scotland Website.

CAT Update:

MISUSE OF DRUGS – SBCAT carried out 9 searches of premises throughout the Scottish Borders during May, 8 of which had positive results. These were as follows;

KELSO – personal amount of herbal cannabis and 105 blue pills (suspected Valium).

JEDBURGH – 38.5g herbal cannabis, knives, sword, bb gun and £620 cash.

PEEBLES – 6.7g cannabis resin, personal amount of cocaine, £4445 cash. Large bag of vapes also seized, suspected of being sold to children.

KELSO – 133g herbal cannabis.

JEDBURGH – 11.8g white powder, personal amount of cannabis, knife.

GALASHIELS – small cannabis cultivation, suspected LSD.

JEDBURGH – 33g heroin, 2.8g cannabis, 1g white powder, 200 valium, 100 benzo, £1250 cash. GALASHIELS – 28g herbal cannabis, knife.

Of note, the recent introduction of the Offensive Weapons Act 2019 has allowed us to seize weapons that are now deemed illegal, such as martial arts type weapons, during searches of houses.

Although the month has been dominated by house searches, we were also deployed to provide locus protection and assist at a house search at an incident at Mosspaul near Hawick, as well as assist at the Jim Clark Rally Event.

ROAD SAFETY – 3 conditional offer tickets for dangerous driving issued.

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH – A working group has been set up to help implement the Community Speedwatch initiative in the Scottish Borders. Community Speedwatch has already been successfully implemented in Fife. This will initially be on a trial basis, and consists of enabling local Community Group volunteers to monitor vehicle speeds in designated places, with a guidance letter being sent to speeding motorists by Police Scotland. Please get in touch if you are interested in setting up a community speedwatch group.

ARREST WARRANTS – 3 persons were arrest wanted on warrant in May by SBCAT.
